








Time trends: Emotion, total






Time trends: positive and negative emotions





Time trends: positive and negative emotions



SESSION BEGINNING...

(four-minute silence)

P: just separate things came into my mind. and (clears throat) I don't know, I guess I've been trying to decide which one is sort of more importantly on my mind. one was the; it's all /; one was, uhm, a feeling I had this morning when I was j -, I just happened to, my eye was caught by a letter I'd thrown away by my mother. and the parts showing from the wastebasket was where she signed her name, said, "love 1" and then signed, "mama". and for some reason it had, had a very strong 4 feeling of, well, anger 5 was the only way I could describe it but it was more than <u>anger 5</u> or it was a variety of things. and it made me feel <u>uncomfortable 8</u>. and I ended up just feeling angry 5. and this really surprised 2 me. it wasn't a letter I'd received recently and that just, it caught my eye quickly and I quickly had this very intense feeling and I sort of had to <u>fight 5</u> against it and then I r -, just was, well, feeling <u>surprised 2</u> that I'd felt that way. and I think the reason I felt the <u>anger 5</u> and, I don't know, a variety of emotions was somehow, seeing the word, <u>love 1</u>, [...] but very often, if I am enjoying 4 having intercourse, it's when I suddenly realize I'm enjoying 4 it that something will happen and I, I lose my ability to enjoy 4 it. SESSION BEGINNING...

(seven-minute silence)

P: I don't know, just thinking about this morning, mainly I think in, of the feeling I keep getting is that I don't, I don't want to talk now. and, uhm, (clears throat) I suppose I, I also had the feeling this morning I think, that I didn't want to come today, and I, I would imagine that's probably partly in reaction to not coming last wee -, at the end of last week. (pause) but also, when I think about today, uhm, well I was thinking mainly about going to *smq this morning to see if there was anything on sale I wanted. and I'd gone with *fni, who then stayed in town, *pwrz, to do some other things, and I went home. and I had *fso with me, and she had *fyh. and, at some point I'm thinking about her arrangements in leaving *mydn, and uh, not so much about john, but I think the feeling I had this morning was very much that *fni knew what to do, or I don't know, somehow, anyway, that she, she was more in control, in charge. and I again, was feeling in some way like a little girl tagging along after her.
